

## Summary

### *“Die Tätergemeinschaft als logisches Problem mit einem Lösungsvorschlag nach G. H. von Wright”*

One of the main difficulties in judging acts committed jointly by more than one offender, is answering the question, to what extent the group's [criminal] effects can be attributed to each individual offender. This essay seeks to provide a suggestion how to solve this problem: After proving that acts actually can possibly be attributed to groups of offenders, the main theoretical difficulties in interpreting conditionals causally are pointed out using a fictive example. The author argues that Georg Henrik von Wright's conditional-analysis of causality can face these difficulties. It is finally shown, that a differentiated attribution of culpability in the different kinds of participation known in German criminal law can be based upon this theory.
